Utilized a Brownfield grant to assist businesses with conducting studies, testing properties and other revitalization efforts.



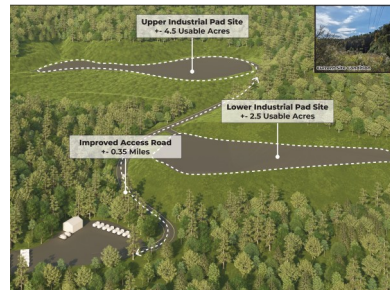
Secured funds and grants for in-car/handheld radios, body cameras, new cruisers, and placing officers in schools.
